Course objective

The main objective of this course is to learn about disasters, consideration on designing resilient structure, Global Practice on Disaster Handling climate change, GLOF and Hydropower Project: Disaster or safeguard , Emergency Response Plan (ERP) for Disaster, Insurance tools for disaster risk & cost components, and procedure for emergency response etc. Disaster preparedness course will consider measures taken to prepare for and reduce the effects of disasters. That is, to predict as far as practicable and—where possible—prevent them, mitigate their impact on vulnerable populations, and respond to and effectively cope with their consequences.

Course content

The course is tailor-made for senior level hydro developers, Project Manager, hydropower consultants, designer Manager-bankers and Manager- Insurance Company, senior officials of DoED, MoEn, NEA and Investment Board.
